

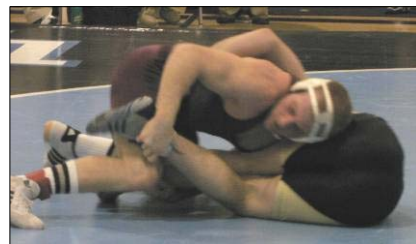
# ***UW-L Results from Mike McCreedy Open***

## ***Held at Upper Iowa University on December 10, 2005***

Six Eagle wrestlers placed at the Mike McCreedy Open held at Upper Iowa University in Fayette, IA on Saturday, December 10, going 33-22 for the day.

### **157 lbs. - Ross Needham of Marshfield, WI**

Ross went 4-1 on the day and placed third. In the semi-finals, Ross had a rematch against Brad Becker of UW-Parkside. Once again, this was a close match with a tied score of 2-2 up until the end of the third period. Right at the end, Becker secured a takedown to get the win. In his final match of the day for third place, Ross faced Travis Eggert of Upper Iowa University. He had beaten him earlier in the day by a score of 3-1. This match would be even closer, with Ross scoring an escape in the second period for the win by a 1-0 decision.



### **165 lbs. - Tim Palmer of Mankato, MN**

Tim went 3-1 on the day and placed second. His big match of the day was his finals match where he faced Kyle Becker of UW-Parkside. This match went the distance. At the end of regulation time, the score was tied at 1-1. They went through the first one-minute overtime, but no one scored. Tim chose down for his first 30-second go and escaped in the last few seconds. However, Becker did the same. They went through the second one-minute overtime period, but again no one scored. Becker chose down for the second 30-second go and got a reversal. The score is now 4-2 and Tim goes down. He is able to get the escape but does not score a takedown -- Becker wins by a 4-3 decision.

### **174 lbs. - Josh Chelf of Irma/Tomahawk, WI**

Josh went 4-1 on the day and placed third including pins against Adam Foreman of Central (1:29) and Greg Meirick of Luther (1:50). The biggest match of the day for Josh would be against All-American unattached wrestler Scott Kauffman of Wartburg University. The first period was scoreless. In the second period, Kaufman chose down and got an escape. Going into the third period and down by a score of 1-0, Josh chose down. He escaped but was then taken down. He escaped again but Kaufman hit a headlock to get the takedown and three-point nearfall for the 8-2 victory. AJ Morgan of UW-Parkside medical forfeited to Chelf in the third place match.

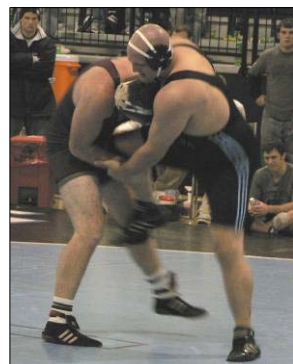


### **184 lbs. - Jason Lulloff of Kiel, WI**

Jason went 4-0 on the day and claimed the 184 lb. championship for the third time this year. He began the day by pinning unattached Jake Sweet in 5:37. He then faced Jase Clark of Upper Iowa, defeating him by a 8-3 decision. In the semi-finals, Jason had a 27 second fall over Northern Iowa's unattached Scott Hazen. His finals match was a rematch from the UW-Parkside Open just one week earlier against Ben Thiem of UW-Parkside. Once again, Jason controlled all three periods, nearly pinning Thiem in the first period. Jason won by a score of 8-2.

### **197 lbs. - Tim Winker of Belgium, WI**

Tim went 3-2 on the day and placed fifth. He started the day by pinning Matt Scott of Central College in 5:47 and unattached Josh Johns in 2:51. In the semi-finals, he faced Division II #5 ranked John Goral of UW-Parkside. Goral got a takedown in the first period, but Tim escaped. In the second period, Tim chose down and escaped, tying up the score 2-2. Goral chose down for the third period, winning with the escape by a score of 3-2 and becoming the eventual champion. Dan Goodson of Upper Iowa medical forfeited to Tim for the fifth place match.



### **HWT - Ryan Allen of Livingston/Iowa-Grant, WI**

Ryan went 3-0 on the day to claim the championship at HWT. With major decision wins over Jaran Rutledge of Knox College (10-2) and unattached Brady Wilson of Mankato State (8-0), Ryan met Division II #8 ranked Brian Black of Upper Iowa. The match was low scoring, with Ryan winning the championship by a score of 3-2.

Andrew Dorn (157), Josh Zabel (174), and Josh Passe (184) all went 2-2 for UW-L, while Kevin Barber (133), Adam Kuchnia (141), and Scott Dorn (165) each finished 1-2. Eric Seppelt (141), Cory Barsness (141), and Chase Gudis (157) each finished 0-2.
